ENCOUNTER

On February 8, 2017, I, Border Patrol Agent (BPA) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), was working in my assigned Patrol Zone in the (b) (7)(E) Border Patrol Station AOR. At approximately 08:00 AM, I received a call via the service radio from Watch Commander (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) that Michigan State Police (MSP) were requesting assistance on a traffic stop at the (b) (7)(E) of (b) (7)(E) and (b) (7)(E) in Monroe, Michigan. I was told to assist Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) who was on her way to the location. At approximately 0830 hours, Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and I arrived on scene and met with Officer (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) of MSP. The officer advised us that he had stopped a burgundy Ford van bearing Michigan license plate (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) for a traffic violation and that both the driver and passenger did not speak English or appear to have any valid identification. The driver of the vehicle was later identified as (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). The passenger was later identified as (b) (6), (b) (7)(C).

Officer (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) gave Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) the identification that the driver, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), and the passenger, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) had presented him at the time of the traffic stop. Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) spoke first with the passenger of the vehicle, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). In the Spanish language, she advised (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) that we were Border Patrol Agents and that we wished to speak with him regarding his immigration status. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) agreed to speak with her and answer her questions. Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) asked (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) of which country he was a citizen. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that he was born in Mexico and is a Mexican Citizen. She asked (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) if he had any legal documentation that would allow him to enter or reside in the United States legally. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that he did not. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) admitted that he had illegally crossed the United States/Mexico International Border sometime around October of 2003. When asked how he crossed the United States/Mexico International Border in 2003, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) admitted that he had crossed illegally afoot near Douglas, Arizona with one other individual. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) claimed that he has not returned to Mexico since crossing illegally in 2003. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) further stated that he has not solicited the United States Government at any point to legally remain in the United States. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that after crossing illegally in 2003, he has been living and working with family in Detroit, Michigan. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) claims to reside at (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) Detroit, MI 48209.

Continuing in the Spanish language, Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) then spoke with the driver of the vehicle, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). She advised (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) that we were Border Patrol Agents and that we wished to speak with him regarding his immigration status. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) agreed to speak with Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and answer her questions. She asked (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) of which country he was a citizen. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that he was born in Mexico and is a Mexican Citizen. She asked (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) if he had any legal documentation that would allow him to enter or reside in the United States. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that he did not. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) admitted that he had illegally crossed the United States/Mexico International Border on or about March of 2002. When asked

<p>how he crossed the United States/Mexico International Border in 2002, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) claimed to have crossed illegally afoot by walking through the desert near Douglas, Arizona with six other subjects. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) claimed that he has not returned to Mexico since crossing illegally in 2002. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) further stated that he has not solicited the United States Government at any point to legally remain in the United States. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that after crossing illegally, he has been living in Michigan ever since. He claims his current address is (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) Detroit, MI 48209.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) were subsequently arrested for entry without inspection into the United States and transported to the (b) (7)(E) Border Patrol Station for further processing. Officer (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) cited (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) (CITATION# (b) (7)(E)) and the vehicle was towed.</p> <p>TRAVEL HISTORY</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that he crossed the United States/Mexico International Border illegally afoot sometime in 2003. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that both of his parents are Mexican citizens. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that he has never solicited the United States Government to legally reside in the United States. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) claims that after crossing the border in 2003, he traveled to Phoenix, Arizona where he stayed for about three years and then drove to Michigan with three others to live and work. He claims that his wife left him years ago and he does not know her whereabouts. He says he now lives with a different woman and his U.S. citizen son at (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) in Detroit. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) claims that he has been working and living in Michigan doing drywall and factory work.</p> <p>PROCESSING</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was processed at the (b) (7)(E) Border Patrol Station on today's date, 02/08/2017. (b) (7)(E) were negative for criminal history. An immigration history check on (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) revealed two previous apprehensions with the Border Patrol on 7/11/03 in Casa Grande, AZ and 10/15/03 in Douglas, AZ, both resulting in a Voluntary Return to Mexico.</p> <p>CONSULATE NOTIFICATION</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was notified of his right to communicate with a Consular Officer from his country as per Article 36 (1)(b) of the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that he wished to speak with the Mexican Consulate. The Mexican Consulate was contacted via phone #313-964-4515 and a consulate officer by the name of (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) spoke with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) regarding his immigration case at approximately 11:25 AM on this date.</p> <p>EMPLOYMENT HISTORY</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) claims that he currently works at various construction jobs in and around the Detroit area doing drywall work.</p> <p>MISCELLANEOUS</p>

<p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) appears in good health and does not claim any medical ailment.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was in possession of \$1,190.00 United States dollars at the time of his arrest. This amount was counted by Border Patrol Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) BPA (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and the subject, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). This amount was counted and recorded on government form (b) (6), (b) (7)(C).</p> <p>DISPOSITION</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) (A# (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)) is being presented with a Warrant of Arrest/Notice to Appear (WA/NTA) at the (b) (7)(E) Border Patrol Station on today's date, 02/08/2017.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) claims to have last illegally entered the United States on or about March, 2003. However, when asked to provide evidence to support this claim (i.e. pay stubs, bills, receipts, etc.), he could not do so. As such, at the time of this encounter, it was determined that he meets the requirements to be classified as a 2c under the Priority Enforcement Program. Other than his oral claim, he is unable to establish to the satisfaction of the immigration officers present that he has been physically present in the United States continuously since January 1, 2014.</p> <p>Furthermore, by claiming over thirteen years of illegal residence in the United States without ever soliciting the government for legal status, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) demonstrates that he has little regard for the immigration law of the United States. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) also admitted to working for cash from his various employers for almost his entire time of his residence within the United States. He admitted that in working for cash that he avoided paying taxes on the income that he earned while illegally present in the United States.</p> <p>Because of his disregard for the immigration laws of the United States, it is therefore in federal interest to present (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) before an immigration judge.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) does not claim fear of persecution or torture if returned to his native country of Mexico.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was provided with a list of free legal services.</p> <p>Space has been cleared and approved by Sargeant (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) for (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to be transported to the (b) (7)(E). All of (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) property (I-77 (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)) and money (G- (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)) will accompany him to the (b) (7)(E).</p>
