Narrative

On 11/21/18 CST Beaudry was dispatched to 100 Michigan St NE (Butterworth Hospital) reference an arson investigation.

On scene CST met with Ofc.'s Rood, J.Johnson and D. Howard. Also on scene were multiple Spectrum security guards.

Overall photographs were taken of the Helipad, which is located on the 11th floor of the hospital. Photographs taken just inside of the helipad doors show two back packs with belongings, a hat with charred cardboard and paper, and a passport. Ofc. Rood indicated the two back packs had been searched for safety purposes before CST arrival. Photographs were then taken of Stairwell 23 which leads to the 12th floor elevator control room. Photographs of the stairwell on the 12th floor show damage to a security entrance pad, a broken door closer cover, and apparent charring located around the ceiling sprinkler system. Photographs were taken of a fire pull station located on the other side of the security entrance door to the 12th floor.

Black fingerprint powder was used to process the door closer cover and both sides of the 12th floor entry door. Positive results were obtained on both. The latents were lifted and photographed.

All items located near the helipad door were collected as evidence. The scene was cleared with Ofc, Howard.

At HQ CST met with Lt. Rogers and Sgt. Griffin from MCT. Photographs were taken of a pair of New balances located outside of an MCT interview room. CST also received a plastic bag of belongings from Sgt. Griffin, the belongings were taken from Jillmar Benigno Ramos-Gomez [REDACTED] by spectrum security. MCT requested CST to photograph all items collected as evidence.

The Multi colored back pack was found to contain: red shorts, swim trunks, gray pajama pants, black zip up sweatshirt, and multiple small in size notebooks.

The brown Dakine back pack was found to contain: maroon t-shirt, striped t-shirt, purple hooded sweatshirt, black knit hat, black with design scarf, soap, padlock, yellow wrap, and UFC weighted gloves, passport and passport mail for Ramos, and a Pistol license application for Ramos.

The plastic bag from Sgt, Griffin was found to contain: orange knit hat, gray winter gloves, reflective belt, black lighter, wallet with ID for Ramos, painted rock, \$.015, USMC dog tag necklace, and property receipt.

The hat was found to contain: partially burned and ripped up Irish Spring soap cardboard. And with the hat was a metal can of cologne, and a bent black comb.

The lighter, and cologne were processed for possible latent prints using super glue fuming. No usable results were obtained.

The pieces of cardboard were processed for possible latent prints using ninhydrin. The papers were placed into a secure FSU locker to allow ample time for latent development.

The latents collected on scene were submitted to the Latent Print Unit for further examination.

All other items (except cardboard pieces) were tagged as evidence and submitted to Property Management Unit via the secure lockers.
