



NARRATIVE:

On 3/19/2014, at approximately 0930 hours, after ending my assigned duties for the day, I, Supervisory Border Patrol Agent **(b) (6), (b) (7)(C)**, stopped for breakfast at the McDonalds

located at (b) (7)(E) Brownstown Township, MI 48134. While standing in my full uniform at the counter waiting for my food, I observed five (5) male subjects enter the restaurant, walk to the counter and order food from the McDonald's employee next to me. As all five subjects individually ordered their food, I observed the employee have extreme difficulty communicating with the subjects. All of the subjects spoke to the employee in broken English and each party had to repeat themselves numerous times to be understood. I received my food and took a seat in the lobby while continuing to observe the subjects. All five subjects made furtive glances at me while they waited for their food and later as they also sat and ate in the lobby. While they ate I was close enough to overhear them speaking to each other solely in Spanish and overheard the Spanish word "policia". I understood this comment to be in reference to me, as I was dressed in my full uniform. While they ate, they continued to make furtive glances at me when they thought I was not looking.

At approximately 1000 hours, all five subjects got up, disposed of their trash and began to exit the restaurant. I observed two of the subjects walk to a dark Ford pickup with the name (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) on the side, while the other three loitered inside. I exited the restaurant, approached the two subjects at the truck and said in English, "Good morning. How are you guys doing today?" Both subjects stared at me with what I believed was a confused look and did not respond. I then asked in English, "Do you speak English?" One of the subjects answered in broken English, "A little." As the subjects demonstrated through their actions and stated that it was hard for them to communicate in English, I switched to Spanish. Continuing in Spanish, I identified myself as a Border Patrol agent and asked them their countries of citizenship. One subject replied "Spain" and the other "Ecuador". I then asked if they had any documents to allow them to be in the United States legally. Both subjects shook their heads and replied, "No". Two more subjects then exited the restaurant and approached the truck. I repeated the process with these two subjects and through questioning determined they were both from Ecuador and did not have immigration documents to allow them to be inside the United States. I placed the four (4) subjects under arrest and awaited the final subject to exit the building.

I observed the final subject exit the building on the opposite side of my location and get into a truck parked in the front of the restaurant. As I was maintaining control over the four (4) subjects I had placed under arrest, I was unable to make contact with the fifth subject at that time. Subsequently, I contacted the (b) (7)(E) Border Patrol Station via my personal cell phone and requested assistance with transportation. While waiting for transportation to arrive, I was approached by a male subject, later identified as (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), who stated that the subjects I had placed under arrest worked for him and were driving a work truck. Mr. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) explained that they were in town from New York State to work in the local area. I explained that the four (4) subjects, based on their own admission, were under arrest for being illegal present in the United States. I asked if the truck that I observed the fifth subject get into was his and he stated, "Yes". I then asked if Mr. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was a citizen of the United States and he replied that he was.

Border Patrol Agents (BPA) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) arrived in two separate marked departmental vehicles and assisted with searching and securing the four (4) arrested subjects. While this was going on, I approached the truck in the front of the restaurant and made contact with the fifth subject. Based on my experiences with the other four

<p>subjects, I immediately identified myself as a Border Patrol Agent and questioned him regarding his citizenship. The subject stated he was from Ecuador and did not have immigration documents to be in the United States. I placed him under arrest and walked him back to the group. Afterwards, Mr. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) assisted me in moving all five subject's personal effects from his truck to the transport vehicle. I asked Mr. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) if any wages were owed to the five subjects and he stated that there were. I provided Mr. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) with directions to the (b) (7)(E) Border Patrol Station, asked that he drive there, and he provide the owed wages to the five subjects. To which, he agreed. Prior to the subjects leaving the scene, I again went to each and asked in Spanish if they had any immigration documents that would allow them to be in the United States legally. Again, all five (5) subjects replied "No". Subsequently, BPAs (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) departed the scene with the five (5) subjects and transported them back to the (b) (7)(E) Border Patrol Station for further processing.</p> <p>Before I departed the scene, Mr. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) asked if I could assist him in moving his work truck out of the McDonald's parking lot. I agreed to assist him and drove the truck to the Kroger parking lot adjacent to the McDonalds. I locked the truck, gave the keys to Mr. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and departed the scene.</p> <p>Based on the five (5) subject's inability to speak English to the McDonald's employee and their furtive glances toward me inside the restaurant, my level of suspicion was aroused. Their actions and statements to me during my consensual encounter in the parking lot in, conjunction with my 17+ years of Border Patrol experience, (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) Through the subject's own admissions to my immigration questions, I determined they were illegally present in the United States. Therefore, I placed them under arrest for violations of the Immigration and Nationality Act.</p> <p>CRIMINAL HISTORY There is no criminal is for (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)</p> <p>IMMIGRATION HISTORY: He has no previous immigration history.</p> <p>Processing of subject was delayed by a day because there was a national outage of the (b) (7)(E) sytem CBP ticket# (b) (7)(E).</p> <p>TRAVEL: (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) claims he left his home in Ecuador in 2006. He travelled by boat to Guatemala where he entered illegally and than travelled by bus to the border with Mexico. He then crossed into Mexico illegally and travelled by bus and by walking until he reached the border with the United States. He claims he illegally entered the United States sometime in June of 2006 and that he paid a smuggler \$9,000. <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was questioned regarding his employment and he stated that he has been working for (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) but only for a short time.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) appears and claims to be in health both physically and mentally.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was questioned and denied having any credible fear of returning to Ecuador and being harmed, nor did he wish to seek asylum.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was served and explained in the Spanish language by Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), service Forms I-200, I-862, I-286 and a list of free legal services. As shown on form I-286 he was given 10,000 bond because he was able to provide agents with a verifiable U.S. address and he has no prior criminal history.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was advised by Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) of his consular communication privileges and he declined.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was in possession of \$451.00 US dollars cash, as verified by Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and Agent (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). His property was assigned I-77 (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) which will go with him to (b) (7)(E) County Jail and his other property will stay here at the (b) (7)(E) Station I-77 (b) (6), (b) (7)(C).</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was offered and declined a stipulated removal, choosing to exercise his right to appear in front of an immigration judge.</p> <p>(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was screened for Deferred Action and is ineligible based on the following criteria: (1) He did not claim to have entered the United States before the age of sixteen.
